- **# 1: Submit Enrollment Deposit**
Required for new students. This deposit is non-refundable.
Due Date: December 15, 2022
 – Pay the [\\$300 Spring 2023 Enrollment Deposit](#).
- **# 2: Submit Official High School Transcripts**
Required for new students
Due Date: January 6, 2023
 – Final official transcripts include a graduation date, final GPA, are signed, and come directly from the high school or college/university.
- **# 3: Submit Immunization Form**
Required for new students
Due Date: January 6, 2023
 – Have your doctor complete the second page of the [Immunization Form](#) then fax or mail documents to the Admissions Office. Sign the last page and send to Admissions via email, fax, or mail. Contact your Admissions Counselor regarding religious exemptions.
- **# 4: Submit Official College Transcripts**
Required for transfer students and dual enrollment students
Due Date: January 6, 2023
 – Official transcript must come directly from college to Admissions.

- **# 1: Change King's Password**
Required for new students
Due Date: Rolling
 – Go to changemypassword.tkc.edu and click "Edit My Password." Enter the username (your @tkc.edu email address) and, when prompted for "old password," use the generic password provided by Admissions then set up your security questions and enter an external email address. Return to changemypassword.tkc.edu and click "Change My Password" and repeat the initial process to change your password.
- **# 2: Log Into King's Email**

 – Go to mail.tkc.edu and log in using your King's username (without @tkc.edu) and new password. It may take five to ten minutes before the new password works.

HOUSING

- **# 1: Fill out House System Application**
Required for all students living on or off campus
Due Date: Rolling until January 15, 2023
 – Log onto tkc-residence.symplicity.com, our housing software, using your full King's email and password. Click "Get Started" on the available application and complete all steps. If you are under 21, a parent or legal guardian must sign the contract for those living in campus housing.
- **# 2: Submit Housing Deposit**
Required only for new students living on campus
Due Date: Rolling until January 15, 2023
 – Pay the [\\$200 Housing Deposit](#). Mailed checks also accepted, Attn: Housing. (The housing deposit is refundable until December 1, 2022 for students applying for the Spring 2023 school year.)

○ # 4: Verify Health Insurance

I-20 AND F-1 VISA APPLICATION PROCESS

○ # 1: Submit your I-20 Application to your Admissions Counselor

Required for international students

Due Date: December 15, 2022

– You will need to include a color copy of your passport, a recent bank statement, proof of income, your King's financial aid award letter, and information from your sponsors. The checklist attached to your I-20 Application will include details about the requirements. You should work closely with your Admissions Counselor through this process.

○ # 2: Apply for your F-1 Visa

Required for international students not currently on an F-1 visa and attending an SEVP-Certified Institution

Due Date: December 15, 2022

– You will receive a “Next Steps for Your F-1 Visa” from your Admissions Counselor once you are approved for your I-20 from The King's College. You will need to complete:

- Using your I-20, fill out your Form I-901 online and to pay the **\$350 SEVIS I-901 Fee**. Keep your SEVIS fee receipt for your records and to apply for your F-1 Visa.

- Using the SEVIS I-901 receipt, apply for your F-1 Visa in person at your local U.S. Embassy or online. You need to file the form DS-160 to apply for your F-1 visa and pay the \$160 visa application fee.

- Schedule and attend your entrance interview with your US Embassy or Consulate. Do not wait to schedule this appointment. Some embassies have wait lists for interviews, so we recommend you schedule your time immediately after paying your SEVIS fee.

FERPA (Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act)

Due to Department of Education FERPA regulations, we are limited in the information we may discuss with parents unless their students complete the "[Authorization for Access to Student Records \(FERPA Authorization\)](#)." This allows us to speak to approved parents or legal guardians regarding their students' accounts.

Note: *Only students will receive official communications regarding accounts, including statement distributions*

Financial Aid

Once your Financial Aid awards appear on your [Student Portal](#), you must accept the aid in the "My Financial Aid" tab in order for it to go to your student account. If a federal loan or grant says "Pending" on your ledger or statement, you have completed the necessary steps to receive the funds. If any aid seems to be missing, please check the "Document Tracking" section for missing items. Information regarding financial aid can be found [on the Financial Aid webpage](#), and the steps to secure aid may also be found on the [Billing Checklist](#).

Billing Statement

Students' billing statements are available in June electronically, along with several inserts explaining steps to take to ensure all charges and credits are properly reflected on that statement. December 15, 2022 Payment Deadline

All payments are due by December 15, 2022. After this date, late fees are applied to student accounts. If the balance on the [Student Portal](#) "My Ledger" tab is a \$0.00 or shows a credit balance, you have completed all payment steps for the deadline.

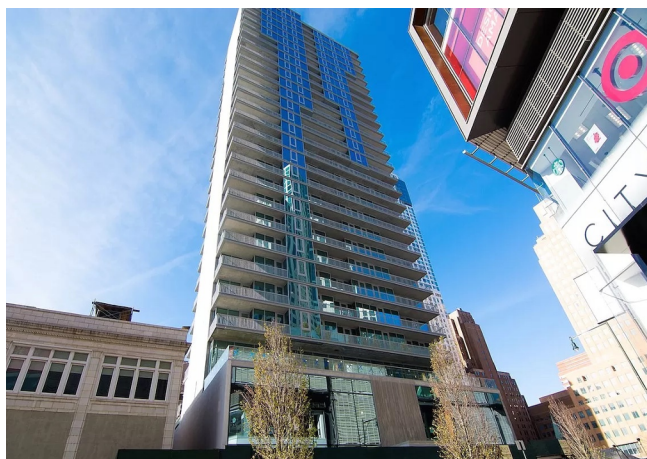

- Find the Building: Approach the building via Albee Square from the south. The entrance for the City Point Residence will be on your left—two large wooden doors.

ATHLETICS AT KING'S

The King's College is a member of the USCAA (United States College Athletics Association), a national governing body similar to the NCAA. All varsity sports compete in the Hudson Valley Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (HVIAC). This includes the opportunity to compete for Conference Championships in the HVIAC and National Championships in the USCAA.

All athletes are eligible for All-American, Academic All-American, and Player of the Week Awards with the USCAA, as well as All-Conference, Scholar Athlete, Player of the Week, and Rookie of the Week awards with the HVIAC. The King's College had 92 student-athletes recognized by our HVIAC conference and our USCAA national governing body in the 2021-22 seasons.



VARSITY SPORTS

The men's soccer team was composed of mostly freshman and sophomores in 2021 and returns a formidable group of players. With a strong group of freshman recruits coming, the team will look to make a run back to the 2023 conference playoffs.

Helmsman

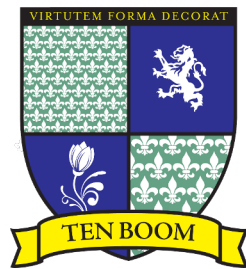
The Helmsman strives to strengthen the

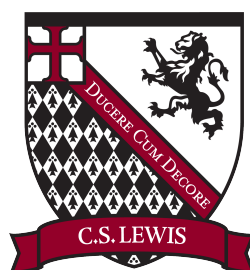
